Aluminum & Tin Cans, Paint Cans	<ul> <li>Please don't squish or flatten cans</li> <li>Keep lids on and press lids inside cans</li> <li>Clean foil (pie plates, tinfoil, etc.)</li> <li>Empty, dry paint cans with lid off</li> <li>Empty and rinse material</li> </ul>	<ul><li>No cooking pots or pans</li><li>No metal clothes hangers</li></ul>
Empty Aerosol Cans	<ul><li>Empty aerosol cans with lids removed</li><li>Cans must be empty</li></ul>	Aerosol cans with remaining contents are considered household hazardous waste
